A.C.C. Approval

Any Resident planning to change the exterior of their property must obtain approval from the A.C.C. Chairman. North Strabane Township will not issue a building permit to any resident of Glencannon unless they have this approval from the association. Approval must be obtained for decks, doors, windows, sidewalks, patios, sheds, painting, etc.

A \$50 fine may be assessed for failure to submit the ACC form with proper approval.

Selling Your Property?

If you are planning to sell your property you will need a "Resale Certificate" signed by a GHA Board Member and the GHA Secretary. The Resale Certificate is issued when all GHA dues and assessments have been received by GHA resulting in a zero balance owed. The Resale Certificate is required for your home Closing.

As a reminder under Act 180, the Association has ten days to provide the Resale Certificate and other items to the seller. Please contact the GHA Secretary as soon as possible so that your Resale Certificate can be prepared.

There is a fee of \$75 for a Resale Certificate.

Attorney Fee Policy

Residents who fail to pay the monthly \$43 assessment for five months or more can expect an official warning letter from Glencannon Homes Association. Failure to respond will result in a letter from the Glencannon Attorney and a \$100 letter drafting fee will be added to the amount owed. Homeowners that force the Attorney file a lien on their property (for lack of payment) will also have those fees added to their account.

Dog Laws

Please remember that Pennsylvania and the township of North Strabane have laws pertaining to DOGS.

Pennsylvania State Law: All dogs must be under control and may not be allowed to run at large. Dogs are personal property and owners are responsible for damages caused by their dogs. This means that when your dog is not on your property, it must be under direct control of you or a handler. The best way to control your dog is with a leash.

North Strabane Township Ordinance:

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog or dogs to allow or permit such dog or dogs to run at large in the township of North Strabane.

We ask that all residents please clean up after your pets. Thank you for your cooperation.

Glencannon ACC regulations require that GARBAGE CONTAINERS are to be stored indoors or inconspicuously outdoors (not in front of your residence).

Garbage containers should be placed at the curb no earlier than 5:00 p.m. the night before collection day,

and must be removed the next day.

Financials

The financial reports were reviewed and discussed. The details of the utilities were discussed at the pool. The board also discussed the details of the AR list.

Rec

The pool pump was discussed as part of the 2023 budget planning. The board discussed getting the prices in the coming months to make the purchase. Additional discussion occurred regarding the pool house renovation planning.

ACC - 2 approved

New Business

The board discussed the details of the 2023 budget and developing the draft for approval. Various areas were discussed for planning including, professional services, office equipment, rec and commons maintenance. The final budget will be provided to the board for a vote. Once the vote is finalized and approved, the budget will be on the website and in the newsletter.

Old Business

The board discussed the snow removal in common areas. This will be paid separately and on as needed basis with Cramer Landscaping or another contractor. The current contract has ended, and a new contract will be discussed in the next few months. The board will collectively gather bids.

Commons

The pond project was discussed, and a planning meeting is scheduled with the engineers in the next few weeks. Additional updates will be published in the January newsletter.

The current landscaping contract has ended and a final walk through has occurred to make sure nothing else is needed. The board discussed obtaining the contract bids for 2023.

Old Business

There continues to be one open board position available

New Business

The board discussed the planning for the renovations to the pool house. A request for proposal will be made once the board obtains a professional consultation. This will establish the details of the work and the cost.

The lights on Upper Hunting Creek were discussed and the original contractor is not able to do the job due to lack of contact. Another company will be contacted. The lights on Village were discussed and will be evaluated at the time the pond lights are replaced. The bench on Old Meadow is being repaired but the contact with the company that it was purchased through is slow.

Open Discussion

None – No residents present.

Mr. Beard made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mrs Gregorchik seconded the motion. Vote: Mr. Krantzyes, Mr. Hogan – yes, Mr. Creighan – yes, Ms. Lopez – yes.

Pond Update

The Pre-Construction Planning Meeting took place at the pond on Thursday, December 22nd. In attendance were representatives from Glencannon, Harshman CE Group LLC, Mullen Excavating, Gateway Engineers (on behalf of North Strabane), Washington County Conservation District, and PA Department of Environmental Protection).

Topics included planning, expectations, safety, as well as two bonds and a permit that are to be put in place. The bonds will allow heavy equipment utilize the roads within North Strabane.

The work is to commence most likely in the month of January. The contract allows for 120 days for completion from the start date. Mullen does not expect normal winter weather should effect the timeline. In fact, he prefers winter time for this type of work.

For the safety of residents, Mullen has asked that no one approach the employees. All questions are to be directed to the Glencannon Secretary. Depending on the number of inquiries, the Secretary may choose to publish them in the Question of the Month section of the Newsletter in lieu of returning every phone call. Calls regarding noise and smells will not be returned as it is to be expected. Construction will only take place during the hours North Strabane permits and some smell from the sludge being removed is to be expected. One of the benefits of doing this project during the winter is that we will not have to worry about bugs and mosquitoes being displaced. Three Boardmembers have been identified to check-in with Mullen employees.

There will be periods when the section of Hunting Creek Road between Glencannon Drive and Cricketwood Court may be either closed or otherwise reduced to one lane with flagger(s) to direct traffic. Please plan accordingly.

No Tresspassing signs will be posted in various areas around the pond, baseball field, and field below the dam as well as game cameras. Whether the signs are present or not, it is expected that no one will be walking around the pond or the two fields when construction workers are present. When workers are not present, residents may walk the path and the fields provided they can remain 50 feet away from any equipment, tools, and vehicles. Under no circumstances is anyone permitted to walk in the bed of the pond regardless of whether it looks dry.

The Board and all in attendance at the Pre-Planning Meeting appreciate the inconvenience that this project may cause, but it will be well worth the effort.



REMINDER:

The only sign that is permitted on Glencannon properties is a real estate (for sale) sign.

Contractor signs, advertising and political signs are not permitted (at any time).

Thank you for your cooperation.

Property Condition:

The GHA board and residents continue to report properties that are in need of repair or improvement.

Letters are sent to these residents regularly identifying what needs done, and completed within 30 days.

Failure to do these improvements can result in a \$50 fine.

Street Parking in Glencannon is prohibited by North Strabane Township.

If there is a planned event and you would like to use street parking for a short amount of time, only the Township can approve that. For all township questions call: 724-745-8880.

Dirt Bikes and Quads are NOT permitted to be driven on Glencannon common grounds (the pond, the ballfield, the pool complex or near the playgrounds).

Several warnings have been issued by the police, GHA has authorized citations for future violations.
